Nelson

Two major pieces of news for parish nurses in the Nelson region. Jane Wulff has finally received word about funding from a special trust in Nelson Diocese, after two years of patiently waiting. Jane has been working at the Cathedral in a voluntary capacity as well as working nights at a local rest home. This demonstrates the acknowledgement that the Anglican Church has in this ministry.

And more... Phil Preece has recently completed her distance training modules and has also received a grant from the Diocese. Her local rural community in the meantime have seen the wonderful work she is doing and bought her a car so she can access the older people in her widely spread catchment area. Furthermore, her main source of employment at the local rest home had been in jeopardy as they were going to close it down but it has had a reprieve. So we thank God for Phil's commitment and faithfulness in the face of great uncertainty.

Meanwhile, I am reaching the final stages of my thesis and Charles is spreading the word, wherever he preaches and visits, of the value of the parish nurse ministry.


